Decision-Making Process**

- Emergency Operations Center (EOC)
- Unified Command (UC) and Incident Command (IC)

Roles and Responsibilities

- Mayor/City Council – adopt resolution declaring disaster
- Commissioners – maybe adopt resolution declaring disaster
-- state and federal government personnel and supplies
- Emergency Operations - David Schworzman (Canyon County Sheriff's Office)
Coordinate equipment and supplies, and how to pay for them
- Police Chief Brian Zimmerman – establish and maintain order
- Mayor Darin Taylor - disseminate information
- authorize and fund assistance and equipment/supplies
- Public Works Forman James Askew – stabilize utilities, and normal operations
- Fire Chief Brad Trosky – lead effort for individual safety
- EMS/Community Relations Officer - Victor Islas (Middleton Rural Fire District)
- Administrative Staff – communication hub (208-585-3133) / normal operations
