## Code Enforcement

Middleton's full-time code enforcement officer responds to written complaints (the form is at [www.middleton.id.gov](http://www.middleton.id.gov)) and also initiates enforcement actions based on personal observation. Please report vicious animals to County Animal Control (455-5920) and to the City Code Enforcement Officer (585-3133). City Code allows RVs/trailers to be parked on a public street for up to 48 hours, otherwise they can be parked on your property (verify it is ok according to any applicable subdivision CCRs). Weeds exceeding 12 inches in height are a violation of City Code.

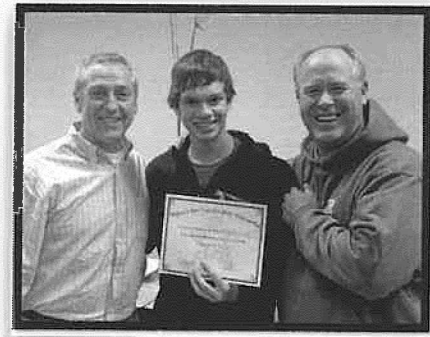

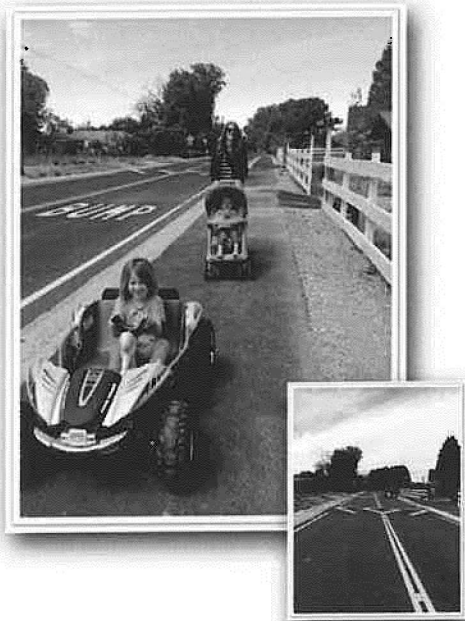

## Minot Street is Open!



Minot Street officially re-opened on May 24, 2013 after being closed during construction. The street project included relocating a fire hydrant, installing concrete storm drain and irrigation boxes, paving, two speed bumps, two streetlights, and a sidewalk along the north side of the street. Although not 100% complete, the project was determined to be substantially complete on May 23, 2013 when a final walk through of the project generated a punch list of items needing completed before the City issues final payment.

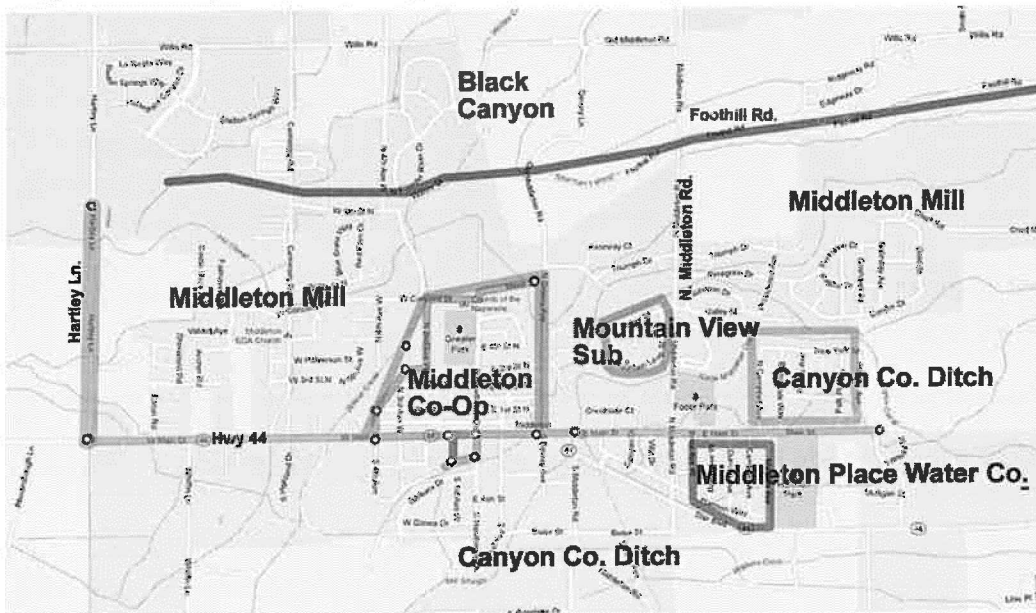

## Have questions about irrigation water?

The irrigation water that flows through ditches and canals in Middleton is managed by several different irrigation districts, not the City of Middleton. The map below is a simplified version of the irrigation district boundaries, an official map can be found at [www.canyonico.org](http://www.canyonico.org).

Some planned subdivisions provide irrigation water to residents for lawn watering via subdivision owned irrigation pump stations. Irrigation companies are responsible to put water in the ditches and keep it flowing. They do not install, repair, clean or manage HOA or individual pump stations. If you have questions about irrigation water please contact your HOA or the irrigation districts directly.

459-4141 serves property north of Foothill, W. Highlands and The Estates at Meadow Park

**Middleton Mill** 585-3207 serves property north of Hwy 44 to Foothill Rd.

**Middleton Place Water Co.** 371-6566 serves Harmon subdivision

### Sidewalk at N. Hawthorne Dr.

A sidewalk is being constructed along the east side of N. Hawthorne Dr. from SH-44 to E. 4th Street N. The project includes relocating one power pole, removing two trees (cut and delivered to the food bank for distribution), relocating two fences and two irrigation lines, placing 48" concrete sidewalks, and marking a street-crossing at E. 4th Street N. to Hawthorne Park.

### S. Highland and Willow Cir.

S. Highland Dr. and Willow Cir. are being re-constructed in the same configuration (streets, curb and gutter but no sidewalks), except stormwater is being designed for subsurface filtration disposal rather than discharge directly into Willow Creek. The project includes storm-drain relocation, full-depth asphalt repair, adjusting utilities to grade, replacing curb and gutter as needed, and four streetlights.

### S. Cemetery Road - In Study and Design

S. Cemetery Road is a federally-funded project, which means that the City pays project expenses and requests reimbursement from the Idaho Transportation Department, which re-pays the City 92.66% (so the City effectively pays 7.34% "matching funds"). The project scope includes conducting an environmental study of the approximately .56 mile area from SH-44 south to Sawtooth Lake Drive, designing the pipe installation of a segment of Willow Creek, designing the future S. Cemetery Road from SH-44 to and including a bridge across Willow Creek, and a 10-foot wide multi-use walk/bike path on the east side of the future S. Cemetery Road.
