This information should help when you have questions. Each of these districts has open meetings that can be attended to understand issues and provide input.

City of Middleton 208-585-3133

City Council meetings: 1st and 3rd Wednesdays at 6:30 p.m., City Hall. The City owns and manages the building, planning and police departments, library, city water and sewer systems, streets and drains, and the following parks: Roadside Park, Centennial Grove, Middleton Place Park, and Piccadilly Park.

Cemetery District 208-585-9394

Cemetery Board Meetings: 2nd Monday at 7:00 p.m. at the Cemetery District Office. Owns and manages the Middleton Cemetery.

Fire District 208-585-6650

Fire District Meetings: 2nd Monday at 7:00 p.m. at the Fire Station. Owns and manages Middleton Rural Fire District.

Greater Middleton Parks & Rec. District 208-585-3461

Middleton – Canyon County – Star

Properties between Middleton and Star are under the jurisdiction of Canyon County. As city limits expand, landowners of those properties can choose to continue to be governed by Canyon County, or can annex into and be governed by the City of Middleton or the City of Star.

State law requires a city to include land in its comprehensive plan before the city can annex that land. Star received an application to annex 1,500 acres, about 800 acres of which is in Canyon County. Star's current comprehensive plan was adopted in 2007 and planned for most of the 800 acres, but not all of it, so Star is expanding its planning area so it can then make a final decision about the Willowbrook Development annexation application.

On April 19, 2018, the Star City Council held a public hearing to consider expanding its planning area west to Lansing Ln., instead of to Kingsbury Rd. as in Star's current plan. Star City Council wanted two public workshops for landowner input, and so continued the hearing until July 24, 2018. High-capacity Public Transportation

On April 2, 2018, the Valley Regional Transit Board approved the final version of the "ValleyConnect 2.0 plan," the updated regional public transportation plan for high-capacity public transportation, i.e. bus rapid transit, and eventually a valley-wide rail system.

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New Crosswalk between Piccadilly Park and Middle School

The crosswalk at Piccadilly Avenue has been relocated west so that Middle School students can cross safely between the school and Piccadilly Park. Parents are asked to drop-off and pick-up students at Piccadilly Park to relieve traffic congestion on the highway.

The crosswalk is signaled with a rapid beacon light. When the button is pressed, drivers are alerted to stop for pedestrians. After school is out for summer break, the hawk light at N. Highland Court will be removed.



Accepting Applications-Middleton Police Department

The city is accepting applications for two patrol police officer positions and a deputy clerk position. Police officers need to be POST certified, and willing to work a variety of shifts depending on the department's needs. The deputy clerk position is full time and will support the department by entering and updating cases and arrest information into computer programs, answering phones, and receptionist duties.

Planning and Zoning Commissioner Positions Available

These positions are appointed by the city council and serve three-year terms. The five-member commission has three vacancies. If you are interested in serving on the Commission, please submit to City Hall an "Application to Serve on the Planning and Zoning Commission," available at City Hall or online at the city's website >> Departments >> Planning and Zoning >> Applications >> last one on the list.

The City of Middleton has a Planning and Zoning Commission that meets the second Monday of each month starting at 7:00 p.m. to do the following:

1. Review design and materials for new businesses and other non-residential buildings,
2. Consider approving conditional use permits and variances at public hearings, and
3. At public hearings, make recommendations to city council about zoning changes and subdivisions.

Commissioner compensation is \$25.00 for each meeting attended. Commissioners must support the community's values adopted in the city's comprehensive plan text and maps, and have a working knowledge of public hearing procedures and the city's zoning and subdivision ordinances.

Rate Adjustment Sewer-Trash

The May 2018 utility bills will reflect sewer rate adjustments based on November - March average water use. Also, rates for residential garbage pickup increased \$12.21 to \$12.54, seniors \$11.14 to \$11.44, according to the consumer price index as required in the city's franchise agreement with Republic Services. The city will continue recycling services at an additional \$0.90/month per customer starting next billing cycle. Republic Services is providing details about what can be recycled. Piccadilly Park Splash Pad Opens On Memorial Day!

Just in time for summer! The Piccadilly Park splash pad is scheduled to be up and running for Memorial Day! The splash pad was designed to be fun for all ages.

The **toddler zone** (left side on the concept design) features mushrooms, flowers and water bubblers; **high use zone** (center circle on concept design) features water rings, water tower with dumping bucket and ground jets; **teen zone** (right side) features water cannons and dumping bucket. The design also features a 'dry zone' grassy (turf) shaded area for parents and grandparents to stay close but not get wet!
