City Seeks Grant to Help Fund Splash Pad in Piccadilly Park

At the January 22, 2015 community meeting, residents gave input on three different design concepts for a splash pad planned in Piccadilly Park. The concept shown below reflects the desired design and features that received the most votes at that meeting.

The 3,000 square foot, zero depth, splash pad features three separate play areas: toddlers' zone with mushrooms, flowers, water bubblers (300 sq. ft.), high use zone with water rings, water tower dumping bucket, ground jets (1900 sq. ft), and teen zone with water cannons, dumping bucket, ground jets (800 sq. ft). The design also features a grassy (artificial turf) shade area, by the toddler zone, for observers who want to be close but not get wet! All features selected for the splash pad are ADA compliant. The design also includes a water storage tank to re-use water from the splash pad to irrigate the park at night.

The City submitted an application to Idaho Department of Parks and Recreation to help fund 50% of the splash pad. Residents can contribute to the park through the Pave the Path to the Park brick program. Bricks can be purchased for as low as \$50.00, include a personal engraved message, and will become a part of the hardscape surrounding the splash pad. If you are using City water for irrigation, City code requires that your backflow assembly be inspected annually.

Inspections need to be completed by an Idaho licensed backflow inspector and turned in at City Hall by May 30, 2015.

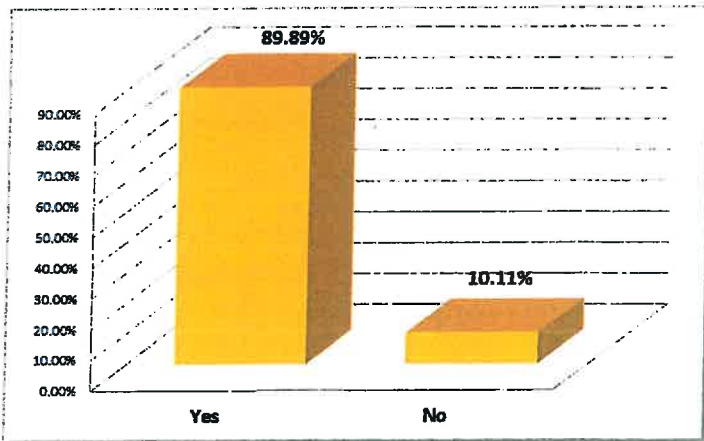

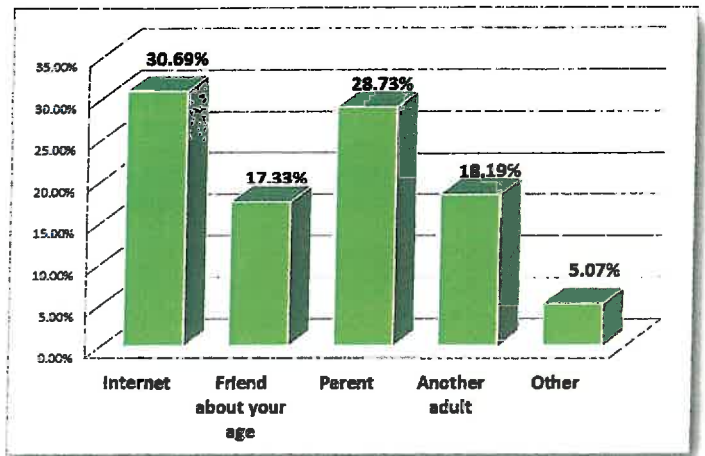
MHS Government Class Survey

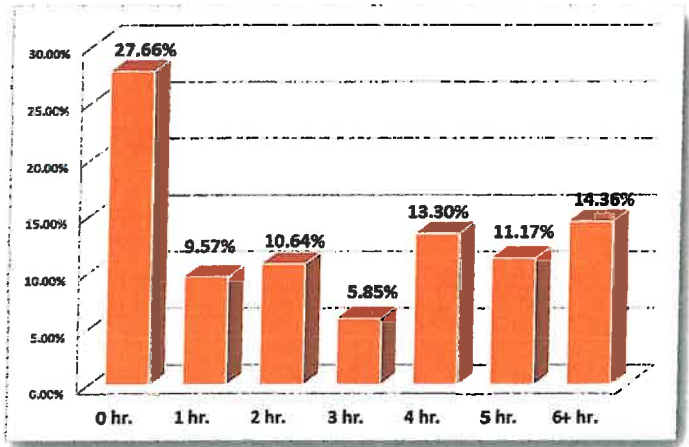

How many hours a day are you at work for an employer earning money, or searching for a job?

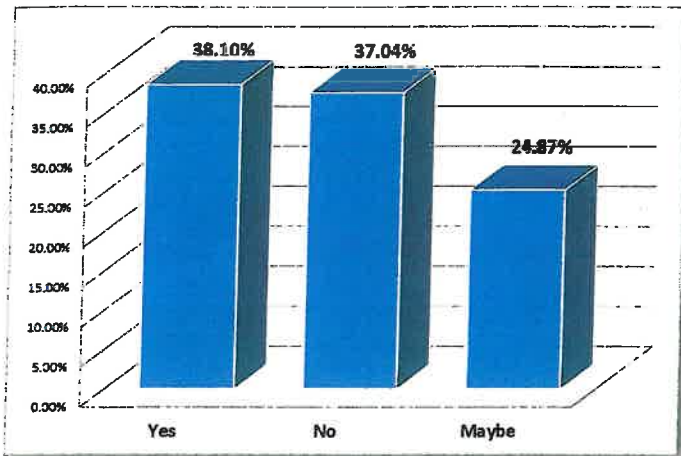


Construction Begins On Walking-Biking Trail

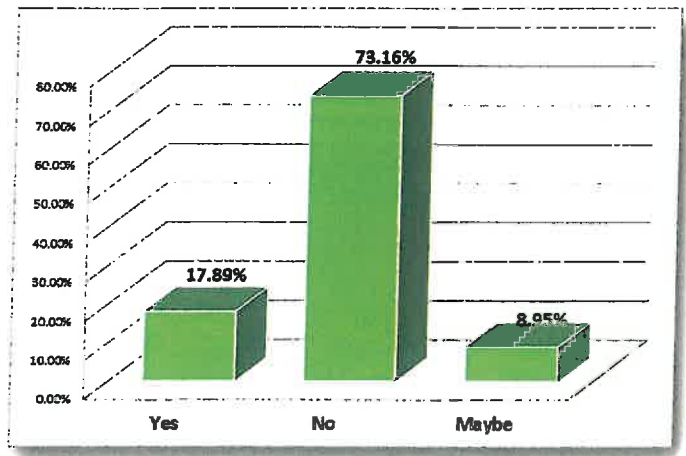
The City was awarded \$101,196.00 from Idaho Department of Parks and Recreation to construct an eight-foot asphalt walking-biking trail connecting Roadside Park to Middleton Place Park on the north side of Highway 44, and then continuing into Middleton Place Park. Removal of sod and dirt in the park will begin late March 2015 and continue through April 2015. The removed sod and dirt will build the base for the tumbling and sledding hill that will be located in the park between the tennis courts and skate pad on the north east side of the park.

Middleton Place Park will be closed or have limited access while work is in progress. The asphalt trail is scheduled to be paved during May 2015 with project completion at the end of June 2015.

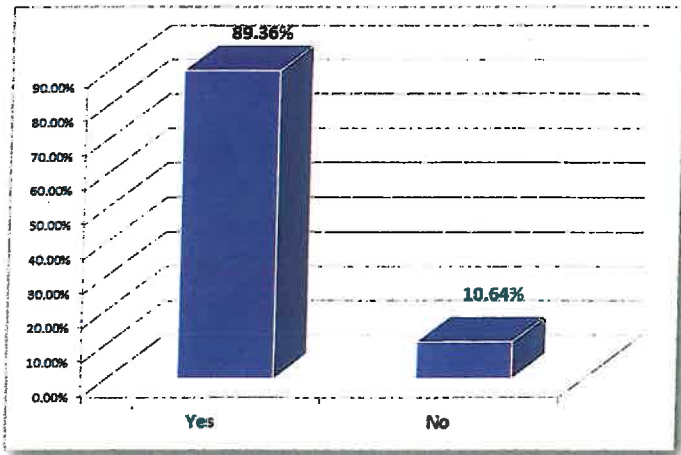
Should the government pay tuition so students can attend college or trade school?



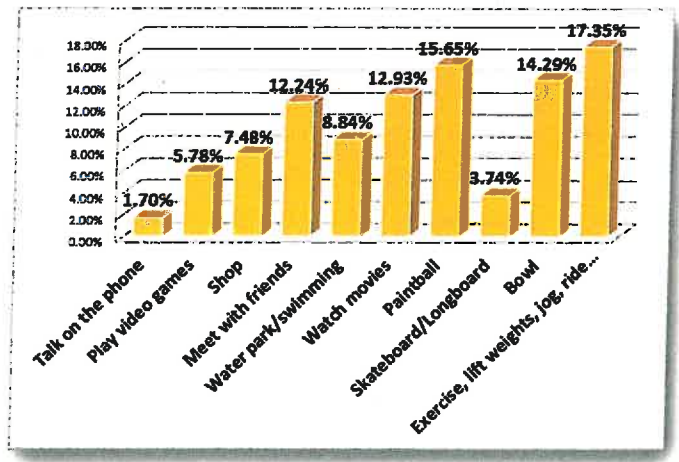
Should the government require individuals to have health insurance, and fine them if they don't?

Project Update: Concord Street / Willow Drive

- Project Scope:** Re-align and reconstruct Concord St., bury water line under Willow Creek, relocate sewer line, and install sidewalk on south side of Concord St. and asphalt trail on west side of Willow Dr.
- Contractor:** ALTA Construction, Warrington Construction, Qualitree
- Schedule:** Substantial completion within 75 days, final completion within 90 calendar days.
- Cost:** Under \$700,000
- Status:** Trees removed from the right-of-way (Contractor: Qualitree) - complete
Water line buried beneath Willow Creek (Contractor: Warrington Construction) - complete
Sewer line relocation (Contractor: Warrington Construction) - complete
Concord St. – asphalt removed and starting work on utility relocation
