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## Highway 44

The Idaho Transportation Department (ITD) suspended work on Highway 44 downtown so the city can isolate and abandon an old 1960s-1970s unmapped water line that had six leaks in the road base during the middle of July.

ITD will maintain the gravel surface downtown and work to minimize dust impacts while the water line work is being done. ITD moved its operations west to resurface the highway between Middleton and I-84. For information regarding the city's work contact Mayor Darin Taylor at 697-4354.

## Risk MAP Project

Hard-copy Preliminary Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRM) for the Willow Creek and Mill Slough areas were released by FEMA September 16, 2016, and can be viewed at City Hall or online mapviewer at:

A FEMA public workshop was held in Canyon County on February 1, 2017. The appeal period started May 17, 2017 and ends August 14, 2017. Individuals with technical information about ground or home elevations different than Army Corps of Engineer's 2014-2015 field study data are encouraged to file an appeal.

If adopted by FEMA, the information on the preliminary maps is scheduled to become effective sometime in the summer of 2018. Please see the quarterly report on the city's website for more information.

## City Budget Hearing

Middleton City Council is scheduled to hold a public hearing on August 2, 2017 to consider adopting a budget for fiscal year October 1, 2017 to September 30, 2018. ### **Fire District** **585-6650**

Fire District Meetings: 2nd Monday at 7:00 p.m. at the Fire Station. Owns and manages Middleton Rural Fire District.

### **Greater Middleton Parks & Rec. District** **585-3461**

Park & Rec. Board Meetings: 1st Thursday at the Parks and Rec. office. Owns and manages Hawthorne Park, Foote Park, and Ed Payne Park.

### **School District** **585-3027**

School Board Meetings: 2nd Monday at 6:15 p.m. at the School District Office. Owns and manages all public schools in the Middleton area.
