



He was preceded in death by four brothers, Howard, Tom, Ora and Richard Anderson and two sisters, Mabel Lenz and Ann Kurtman.



As members of the PVA, Juanita and Wayne not only served as counselors for handicapped veterans, but they were instrumental in eliminating barriers to public buildings that exist to handicapped people throughout the United States. Juanita opened their home to physicians visiting from all over the world as a model for handicapped living. She was an accomplished artist whose hobbies included investing in the stock market and traveling.

Wayne Capson, 55, of Garden Grove, Calif., died Tuesday, Feb. 9, 1988, at a Long Beach, Calif., hospital.

Mr. Capson was born February, 27, 1932, and served his country in the United States Marine Corps in Korea where his combat wounds caused him to be a paraplegic.

He was a devoted leader of the California Paralyzed Veterans Association, a member of the Paralyzed Veterans of America, Inc., Mr. Capson helped that organization further the needs of the veteran, and his or her dependents, and all catastrophically disabled by serving as National President from 1968 through 1970,



as California Chapter President from 1965 through 1968 and 1973 through 1975, and as a National Service Officer from July 1978 to February 1988.

He is survived by his wife of 34 years, Jaunita Capson.

If the measure of a man's immortality is related to the good he does in serving his fellow man, then Wayne Capson's spirit will live on among those who knew and were influenced by his life forever. This gentle, kind, dedicated and good man achieved greatness in his help to others, especially those who shared disabilities similar to his own.

In 1953 he was married to Juanita, a quadriplegic veteran whom he had met in the hospital. Thus began a remarkable marriage and partnership that strengthened them both and encouraged their personal growth and determination to be of service to others.

The next decade was spent in an increasingly active social life and public service through various organizations. Wayne found an outlet for his deep need to serve others through the PVA. This work and his unassuming leadership abilities led him naturally into the National PVA affairs and in 1968 he began a two year term as National President of PVA.

That was a time of maturing for the national organization and established a foundation for its subsequent growth and extended programs which became possible to a large extent based on the dreams and goals instilled in the organization by President Capson.

He was recognized with National PVA's highest honor, the widely respected 'Speedy' award for distinguished contributions.

Having completed his service to National PVA, Wayne once again turned his talents towards serving the California Chapter. Later, Wayne turned his sights on the National Service Officer program and became one of their senior and most respected Service Officers. He was acquainted with the legislation, the VA

rules and regulations, the human needs and the society's intended provisions for disabled veterans. This knowledge, combined with his lifelong need to be of service to others led him to become a most dedicated Service Officer. His own time was greatly sacrificed to this service: he worked long hours, gave remarkable attention to details, gladly served anyone who called upon him for help regardless of their VA status or type of disability, but more, he was interested in people and his interest always was sincere and profound.

Some years ago I had occasion to spend an extended period in the hospital, and regularly my dear friend would show up in the evening to visit at 7:00 or 8:00 pm, although he may have been up since 4:00 am and at work since 8:00 am. He always remained cheerful, concerned, interested, helpful and ready for a good visit regardless of the stress upon him. His devoted wife and companion was glad to make the sacrifice of their time together in order that he might fulfill his call to service.

Wayne's death is a loss we all feel acutely, but we must lake comfort in the privilege of having known and shared a part of our lives with this gentle, humanitarian man, and in the memory of his quiet sense of humor, his great devotion to his fellow man and the example of a truly caring person. He will live in our hearts as long as they beat and in our spirits forever.

Dickie Claude Hill was a chief warrant officer 4 for the United States Army. Dickie was born on July 16, 1943 and was from Boise, Idaho. On September 9, 1989, he died in a non-hostile incident in the United States at the age of 46.

National Guard search Helicopters found the downed helicopter wreckage 25 miles southeast of Boise,

near Danskin Peak.

Killed were the pilots: Chief Warrant Officer 4 James R Bollar 39 of McCall and Chief Warrant Officer 4 Dickie C Hill 46 of Boise.

The crew chief Sgt Charles L Hansen 28 of Boise was also killed.

The Huey was a Vietnam-era aircraft about 20 years old. It left Gowen Field in Boise around 5 p.m. Saturday on a training mission and had been due to return by 6:30 pm. Search efforts were called off at midnight Saturday and resumed at sunrise Sunday.

Dickie C. Hill, 46, of Boise, died Saturday, Sept. 9, 1989, in a helicopter accident.

A committal service with military honors will be held at 10 a.m. Thursday, Sept. 14, at Middleton Cemetery. A memorial service will be held at 12:30 p.m. Thursday, Sept. 14, at the First Church of the Nazarene, 1200 No. Liberty, Boise. Dickie's close friend and pastor, James Seely of the Fellowship Baptist Church will officiate at both services. Services are under the direction of Flahiff Funeral Chapel, Caldwell.

Dickie was born July 16, 1943, at Ontario, Ore., a son of Claude and Ila Harney Hill. He attended school at Middleton. He went to Army flight school at Fort Rucker, Ala. and Fort Walter, Texas, and served in Viet Nam. He received the following r Medal, Humanitarian Service Medal, Army Reserve Components Achieve military honors: Aiment Medal (3 awards), Armed Forces Campaign Medal (4 awards), Viet Nam Service Medal, National Defense Service Medal and Army Service Ribbon. He married his high school sweetheart, Claudette Wilcox on Sept. 1, 1967, at Caldwell. When he returned home from Viet Nam, he joined the Boise Fire Department and served for almost 19 years. He spent the early part of his career working at the airport fire Stations around the aircraft he loved. For 10 years, he was captain fire dispatcher before returning to fire suppression in 1984. He worked at Station 8 through the rest of his career.

Fire Battalion Chief, Ray Walters said, "Dickie was known as a hard-working, caring firefighter who loved his work and was loved by the people who worked with him. All who knew Dickie admired and respected him." "Dickie had a quick Wit," commented Fire Department Chaplain, Mel Hadley. "He made work fun. Dickie could always see the amusing side of things regardless of the seriousness of circumstances."

He was preceded in death by his father, Jack Montgomery; his mother, Nora Montgomery; his granddaughter, Liliana Deleon, and many aunts and uncles.



Mom remained on the farm with her son Jeff, after Robert's death in 1984, until health problems forced her to move to assisted living in 2005. Mom was lovingly cared for at Aaronbrook Place in Boise until her death last Friday, Nov. 9, 2007.

As we sorrow for her passing, we remember her wonderful qualities and abilities.

A devout Catholic, she inspired us to reflect on life and its mystery, in her stoicism she modeled tenacity and strength. She was bilingual in English and Croatian, played accordion and harmonica, was a crack marksman and could whistle loud enough to call back the oil truck driver from 2 blocks away after he missed our drive.

She loved to argue religious doctrine and visit with her neighbors. She was generous, helping us all through financial hard times as she could, and made wonderful hungarian goulash and povitica, a croation walnut bread. We will miss her now and remember her with love and gratitude.

She is survived by her three children, two grandsons, and three great-grandchildren.
