Emergency Operations - David Schworzman (Canyon County Sheriff's Office)

Coordinate equipment and supplies, and how to pay for them Police Chief Brian Zimmerman — establish and maintain order

Mayor Darin Taylor - disseminate information

- authorize and fund assistance and equipment/supplies

Public Works Forman James Askew – stabilize utilities, and normal operations

Fire Chief Brad Trosky – lead effort for individual safety

EMS/Community Relations Officer - Victor Islas (Middleton Rural Fire District) Administrative Staff – communication hub (208-585-3133) / normal operations
