## **Property Tax**

State law requires cities to use water and sewer utility payments to operate, maintain, repair, and improve water and sewer systems. Water revenue cannot pay for sewer, street or park expenses; likewise, sewer revenue cannot be used to pay for water street or park expenses.

pay for water, street or park expenses.
The Idaho legislature has determined that real property taxes pay for maintenance, operation, repair, and improvement of streets, parks, libraries, law enforcement, and city administration. Fuel and sales tax revenue is shared between Idaho Transportation Department (ITD) and among all cities, counties, and highway districts responsible for maintaining streets and bridges. This is called "revenue sharing," and Middleton receives a small amount of those taxes.

The City's real property levy rate is derived by taking the amount of Property Tax Dollars requested by the City divide by the Taxable Value of all real property in Canyon County determined by the Canyon County Assessor.

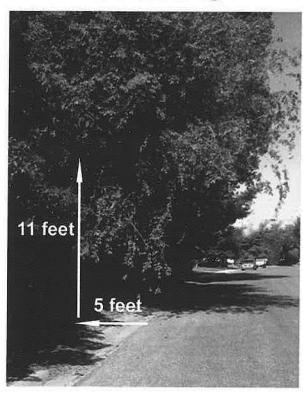
Property tax dollars (requested by City)

The tax levy rate is the result of a mathematical calculation, and neither the County or City "set" the tax levy rate.

#### **RESOLUTION NO. 277-09**

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MIDDLETON, CANYON COUNTY, IDAHO, ESTABLISHING AN UPDATED SEWER RATE FEE SCHEDULE AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the City of Middleton find it necessary for the City to increase the sewer user rates based on the fixed and variable costs associated with running the city's sewer system.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MIDDLETON, CANYON COUNTY, IDAHO, as follows:

Section 1: That the City of Middleton hereby establishes the following sewer user rates which shall take effect as shown in incremental steps effective on the chart below:

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the City of Middleton after reviewing budgets, expenditures, costs of operation and the system sping to evaluate the adequacy of income against projected expenditures, and

### **New Utility Account Policies**

	<b>Previous City Policy</b>	New City Policy
Owner Initiates Services	Customer must fill out and sign new account form.	A landowner can initiate services (open an account) in person or over the phone and the City obtains customer information. The City confirms ownership using the county's parcel base map, or the owner must provide proof of ownership (deed or contract) if ownership is different than shown on county records. Owner signs Owner-Tenant Authorization if property is intended as a rental. The Owner can sign one agreement and have it on file at the City for new tenants to sign.
Tenant Initiates Service	Landlord Tenant Agreement must be signed; owner's signature must be notarized; photo ID; copy of deed of trust required	A tenant can initiate services in person at City Hall by showing a photo ID, paying a \$100.00 deposit, and signing a Cwner-Tenant Authorization
New Service/ Account fee	\$15.00 non-refundable	\$15.00 non-refundable
Pro-Rate Initial Bill	No	Utility bills are pro-rated from the date services are initiated.
Owner Changes to Account	Owner may initiate account changes by email, fax, or mail. Change request form must be signed; the City does accept a note signed by owner.	A landowner can change an account in person or over the phone after verifying the property address/account number, phone number on the account, and the last 4 digits of owner's social security number.
Tenant Changes to Account	Tenant may update their personal information but cannot make changes to service approved by owner.	A Tenant in person or over the phone can make limited changes to an account after verifying the name/account number, phone number on the account, and the last 4 digits of the social security number.
Owner Close Account	Owner can close the account over the phone or in person.	A landowner in person or over the phone, after verifying the name/account number, phone number on the account, and the last 4 digits of the social security number, can provide a final billing address and request services be terminated/closed. The account will be closed when final account balance is paid in full.
Tenant Close Account	Tenants cannot close the account. The tenant can request to be taken off the account and a final bill sent.	Tenants cannot close an account but can terminate service and ask to be removed from an account. A tenant in person or over the phone, after verifying the name/account number, phone number on the account, and the last 4 digits of the social, can provide a final billing address and request services in tenant's name be terminated. The service will be terminated when the final bill balance is paid in full.
Final Collection	Final bill is due upon receipt. Notice to send to collection sent after 15 days, if account remains delinquent after 45 days the account is sent to collections.	Final bills are mailed to the final billing address provided by the owner or tenant. If not paid within 10 calendar days, then the City will send a notice of intent to prosecute and forward to a debt collector for collection.
Pro-Rate Final Bill	No	Utility bills are pro-rated to the date services are terminated.
