
Safety Is A Priority

One of the many reasons people choose to live in Middleton is safety. We all enjoy the safety of a small community and knowing our neighbors. Knowing this, the City place law enforcement as a priority, and currently contracts with Canyon County Sheriff's Office (CCSO) for it's law enforcement services.

Currently CCSO povides coverage twenty four hours a day. seven days a week with as many as four cars patroling the streets at the same time.

Definition of Terms:

Community Policing: Deputies talking to residents. solving problems, understanding community concerns

Animal Control: Stray animals, animals creating a traffic hazzard, animal bites, animal complaints

Property Crime: Theft and burglary

Public Offense: Disturbing the peace, vandalism Idaho Code Enforcement: Parking problems Persons Crime: Domestic battery, battery, rape

Juvenile Offense: Curfew, runaways, juvenials beyond

control, loitering

Drug Offense: Possessina, selling, distributing drugs

Traffic Accident: Car crash, hit and run crashes

Traffic Offense: Speeding, no insurance, inattentive

driving, reckless driving

Fraud/Forgery: Scams, mail or phone calls attempting

to collect money falsely

Civil Process: Service of subpoenas, protection orders,

court orders

Warrant Service: Service a warrant for arrest

Weapons offense: Possession of an Illegal knife or firearm

Does Middleton Have a Curfew?

Yes. Curfew is one of the biggest problems in the Middleton area. With the change in weather and school being out soon, children will be spending more time outside, and later into the evenings. Vandalism and other juvenile crimes can be directly attributed to curfew violations. **Middleton's curfew is strictly enforced**. Middleton City Ordinance 264 sets the following times for juvenile curfew:

Juvenile Curfew under 16:

10:00 p.m. - 6:00 a.m.

Juvenile Weekday curfew (Sunday through Thursday) age between16 &18:

11:00 p.m. - 6:00 a.m.

Juvenile Weekend curfew (Friday and Saturday) age between 16 &18:

12:00 a.m. - 6:00 a.m.

Ordinance summary: "It is unlawful for any juvenile to remain upon any street, highway, road, alley, park, playground or other public place, or buildings or places of amusement, eating establishments, vacant lots and/or any other place, without being accompanied by an adult having custodial rights or an adult person designated by the adult having custodial rights." What can I do around my property to increase safety?

Increase your lighting: install motion sensitive lights

Cut back trees and shrubs, making the property clear and visible to people and elinminate potential hiding places

Keep items on your property organized and easy to recognize if objects are missing

Keep vehicles, doors, and windows locked

Talk with neighbors, watch over each other's properties

Does Middleton have gang activity?

Gangs are not one of the largest problems in the Middleton area, but there have been signs that there are members living in the area. There are all types of gangs, of all different sizes. Below is a list of some common ways to help identify gang members. Keep in mind just because a group of people might meet some of the below characteristics does not mean they are a gang. They should be treated the same as you would treat anyone else. If you suspect gang activity, call 454-7531 to report it immediately.

Large and small groups of people who associate closely, often execlusively, for social reason, especially to engage in criminal behavior

Individuals often wearing the same colors

Individuals making hand signals to represent numbers and letters

What do I do if I see something suspicious? need to make a police report? think someone is selling drugs? or there is a juvenile problem at the park near my residence?

Call the Canyon County Sheriffs Office. The CCSO has two different phone numbers for you to call. If you have an emergency or see something that needs immediate police attention call 911. For non-emergency situations call the CCSO dispatch number 454-7531. When you call, report who, what, where, when why and how, give as much description as you safely can. Examples: vehicle description, license plate, direction traveling, clothing, description of suspicious person etc. You don't need all these things to call, but the more information you have increases the ability of law enforcement to solve the problem.

Do not hesitate to report a problem, you can remain anonymous no matter what your reason.

Unreported crimes only lead to more crime. The most important part about calling is making the call that way police know there is a problem and can begin to solve the problem while keeping people safe.

Survey Results

In the March 2012 edition of the Middleton City Update residents were given the opportunity to give input on <u>possible</u> city projects through the "Resident's Choice Survey". Provided is a short summary of the survey results*. Please attend the May 16, 2012 City Council Meeting for complete results or check the city website at www.middleton.id.gov after May 16, 2012.

It is important to understand that money will not be immediately spent on the top ranking projects. Many projects may qualify for grants, may be best completed by partnering with other organizations, and some may require budgeting over several years. The city objective is to understand where the residents want their tax dollars spent so that projects can be appropriately budgeted and prioritized.

The purpose of this survey was to gather data and opinion from the community on possible city projects, to understand the importance of those projects directly from the city residents, and those living in the greater Middleton area since Middleton is home to them as well. The top survey results will be further refined in an another survey to residents in June 2012.

City leadership recognize that those who live within city limits are directly impacted by city government spending and consider their opinions a priority. Therefore the survey results were separated to clearly identify the desires our community:

- 1. Total Survey Results (all survey data recieved)
- 2. Results from within city limits
- 3. Results in county zip code 83644
- 4. Results from unidentified surveys

City leaders believe in a community driven approach to government and will continue to ask input from surveys, town hall meetings, city council meetings etc. All residents are encouraged to visit with city council members or stop by City Hall if you have concerns or questions.

*The survey required a name and address in order to be accepted, surveys without name and address were categorized "unidentified".
