City Council Upholds Long-range Plan

Recent Planning and Zoning, and City Council, decisions followed the comprehensive plan. A Tractor Supply Co. (TSC) store broke ground west of Perfection Tire, and anticipates opening by the end of summer to sell the types of products available at D&B in Caldwell. A more dense development, Sawtooth Lake Subdivision, along the city's Transit Oriented Development (TOD) route located east of Middleton Lakes Subdivision, was approved for 102 residential lots on about 23 acres, and the first phase should be starting in August 2018. Stonehaven Subdivision located east of Middleton High School was approved for 243 lots on about 75 acres, including construction of W. 9th Street between Emmett Rd. and Hartley Ln.; lots are a minimum of 8,000 square feet.
