

City of Middleton Awarded \$30,000 Implementation Grant

The City of Middleton was awarded a \$30,000 implementation grant from the Community Planning Association of Southwest Idaho (COMPASS) for the Concord Street and Willow Drive Trail Connection project. The implementation grant will reimburse 50% of cost to design the street project. The project meets several COMPASS Communities in Motion 2040 goals by improving multi-modal access to schools and jobs; provides a new sidewalk and trail that allow off-street pedestrian transportation and will make the City of Middleton more walkable, bikeable and livable by creating connected access from neighborhoods to parks and schools. The project is scheduled for construction in FY 2015.


Piccadilly Park Master Plan

The City Council approved the Piccadilly Park master plan and the skate-park concept plan at its meeting on June 4, 2014. Many City residents attended planning meetings in May to identify the features they would like to see in the park and skate-park: outdoor exercise equipment, zip-line, interactive creek, amphitheater, farmers market, restrooms, pavilions, etc. Baer Design Group, landscape architects, designed and presented the park master plan, and Grindline designed and presented the skate-park concept plan. The response was electric! The plans will be used by the City in grant applications, and \$45,000 in donations and grant funds have been received already to build the skate park. The park will be developed in phases over time and as budgets allow.

The 13,500 square-foot world-class skate park is being constructed in 2015. The park was designed with Grindline Skatepark's "Ladder of Progression" design philosophy, meaning that the design caters to all ages and skill levels - a place for beginner and intermediate skaters to develop and hone their skills, while also providing terrain that will be fun and challenging for users at the most advanced level.

Based on Middleton skater desired features, the park hosts a flowing street course with features such as handrails, flat ledges, a hubba ledge, manual pads, stamped-brick banked ledges, banks, stairs, a quarterpipe, a hip, a bacon strip, banked wedges with a gap, and a bowl featuring various depths, hips, copings, and extensions.


