Cemetery Board Meetings: 2nd Monday at 7:00 p.m. at the Cemetery District Office. Owns and manages the Middleton Cemetery.

Park & Rec. Board Meetings: 2nd Thursday at the Parks and Rec. office. Owns and manages Hawthorne Park, Foote Park, and Ed Payne Park.

Trash Services Mini-Survey Results

In the September 2017 FrontPage newsletter the city requested feedback regarding trash services. Below are the tallied responses.

Question: The city contracted with Republic Services for solid waste disposal and recycling, and budgeted \$603,100 in Fiscal Year 2018 to pay for those services. If garbage pick-up was every other week, instead of every week, costs to residents could be reduced.

148 Prefer weekly garbage service

30 Prefer every other week garbage service

Based on resident feedback, the city will continue a weekly garbage pickup schedule and costs.

River District Concept

The River District is a name, not a taxing district, and is generally the area between the Boise River and Highway 44, and between Duff Lane and Emmett Road. "Thank you" to residents for submitting ideas about activities and features in the future public city park, called "Riverside Park," which will consist of four areas, each named after the donor, totaling approximately 178 acres when finished.

The concept plan inside this issue highlights infrastructure projects anticipated to be constructed during the next 10 years by the city, developers, or both working together. The Legend at the top right of the concept plan explains the symbols. Projects take multiple years to complete without going into debt or consistently raising taxes ... construction costs raised about 40% since May 2017!


Parking lots are near the restrooms, covered picnic tables (shelters), and the two float tube/raft ramps near Middleton Rd. and Whiffin Ln. Wildlife habitats are integrated with meandering nature trails on about 45 acres east of a 3-acre dog park and west of a fishing pond. Equestrian trails on the 42-acre parcel south of Middleton Lakes Subdivision are furthest from parking lots to allow horses to stretch their legs. A paved greenbelt is planned along the river. A Riverside Park masterplan will be prepared based on the concept plan and community input at an open house to be scheduled in February or March 2018.
