Grant Application: Coast-to Coast Pedestrian/Bike Trail

Grantor: Community Planning Assoc. of Southwest Idaho
Grant Funding Requested: \$15,000
Description: This project will help plan the trail connecting Lakes at Telaga subdivision on Kingsbury Road and Middleton High School.
