Candidate Forum March 8, 2018

Primary Election - May 15, 2018 General Election - November 6, 2018

There are no elections for city officials in 2018. State law schedules elections for mayors and city council members on opposite years as "partisan" elections. Partisan elections require a candidate for state, congressional or county offices to declare whether they are a candidate for the Republican, Libertarian, Democratic or Constitutional party.

The May 15, 2018 Primary Election is to determine which candidate will be on the ballot for each party on November 6, 2018.

To find your voting location go to: canyonco.org -- select "Departments" -- "Elections" -- then click on the "Where Do I Vote" and enter your address.

Candidates for all state, congressional and county positions are invited to meet and speak with residents in a Middleton Candidate Forum on March 8, 2018 beginning at 7:00 p.m. at the Trolley Station, 310 E. Main Street, Middleton. Each candidate will be given five minutes to speak and five minutes to answer questions. Candidates will have multiple times to speak if time allows.

The deadline for filing a Declaration of Candidacy at the Canyon County elections office for a county position is 5:00 pm March 9, 2018. Known positions and anticipated candidates are listed below. Everyone is invited to the forum. Voting is open from 8:00 am – 8:00 p.m. on election days.
